Best Practices for Linking Files in OneDrive to Blackboard

Blackboard has a very limited amount of storage space for large files. In this workshop, we will show you how to use OneDrive to store your files and link them to your Blackboard courses.

Building a Sense of Belonging with Flipgrid

Explore Flipgrid, a free interactive tool that allows your online students to engage with you and their classmates by recording and sharing short video clips to build a sense of community as well as process course content. Flipgrid includes accessibility features and can also be embedded in Blackboard. A smart phone is highly recommended for this workshop.

Through it, instructors can connect with their students real-time, making it possible to share and store files, as well as communicate through video conferencing and direct messaging via mobile devices or directly inside Blackboard's LMS platform. Preventing Cheating During Online Exams with LockDown Browser & Respondus

LockDown Browser is a custom browser that locks down the testing environment in Blackboard Learn. When students use LockDown Browser to take a Blackboard test, they are unable to print, copy, go to other websites, access other applications, or close a test until it is submitted for grading. Tests created for use with LockDown Browser cannot be accessed with standard browsers, either. This comprehensive training webinar is intended for instructors who plan to use LockDown Browser and/or Respondus Monitor with online exams. This session will cover how to enable Lockdown Browser/Monitor in a Blackboard test, sequence options and settings requirements, efficient review of the assessment data collected, and flag review.

Student Discipline in the Classroom

The New Normal: Web 2.0 Tools for Instruction

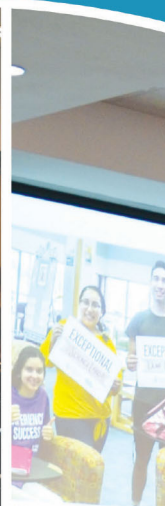
